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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN:

(1) UEMS (European Union of Medical Specialists); an international non-for-profit organization incorporated under the laws of Belgium, having its registered seat at 24 rue de l'Industrie, 1040 Brussels – Belgium, acting through its Multidisciplinary Joint Committee of Rare and Undiagnosed Diseases [MJC RUD], hereby validly represented by Vassilios Papalois, UEMS President, Joao Grenho, UEMS Secretary General, and Béla Melegh MJC RUD President, Alessandra Renieri, MJC RUD Secretary, Domenica Taruscio, MJC RUD Vice-President,

Hereafter: "UEMS"

and

EURORDIS – Rare Diseases Europe is a non-governmental patient-driven alliance of patient organisations representing over 900 rare disease patient organisations in 74 countries. EURORDIS is represented by Ines Hernando, Healthcare & ERN Director and Matthew Bolz-Johnson, Healthcare Advisor under this partnership with the UEMS on the development and delivery of the European Board for Rare & Undiagnosed Diseases.

Hereafter: "EURORDIS"

The parties sub (1) and (2) shall hereafter be referred to individually as a "Party" an collectively as the "Parties".

RECITALS

The UEMS and EURORDIS are active in areas relevant to the quality of medical specialist practice in rare and undiagnosed diseases in Europe primarily, but with global holistic availability and to the quality of care for the benefit of patients around the world. The Parties are willing to create a partnership that will promote and facilitate their activities in this area.

The overall goal of collaboration and cooperation is to define joint actions, to achieve the best possible outcomes and to increase visibility of both parties.

The parties seek through this Memorandum of Understanding ("MoU") to define their partnership, to explore and to develop new opportunities in accordance with their objectives and competence. Through this MoU, the Parties also aim to establish an efficient and transparent communication between them.

THE PARTIES DECLARE THAT

1. SCOPE

This MoU outlines the principles of collaboration between the UEMS and EURORDIS.

2. INTENTION OF THE PARTIES

The Parties acknowledge that this MoU does not, and is not meant to, constitute a legally binding agreement between them. Whenever an activity undertaken by both Parties would require a formal legal framework Parties will conclude a formal, legally binding agreement.

The non-binding relationship between the UEMS and EURORDIS governed by this MoU is that of independent contractors. Nothing contained in this document will be construed as constituting any other relationship between the Parties.

This MoU does not prevent or limit EURORDIS or UEMS to enter agreements with other parties. Both Parties declare that they will not enter agreements that would jeopardize or invalidate this MoU and, whenever reasonable doubt would arise as to whether a new agreement is likely to be in conflict with this MoU, the Parties will communicate and strive to resolve outstanding issues.

3. INTERNAL POLICIES

Subject to the terms of this MoU, the implementation and pursuit of the goals, objectives, conditions and terms of this collaboration will be carried out in accordance with the internal policies and procedures of each Party.

4. SCOPE OF COMPETENCES AND ROLES

a. **EURORDIS**

EURORDIS seeks to improve the quality of life of people living with rare diseases in Europe through advocacy at the European level, support for research and medicines development, facilitating networking amongst patient groups, raising awareness, and many other actions designed to reduce the impact of rare diseases on the lives of patients and family. EURORDIS maintains its independence as core operational costs are independent from any public and corporate funding.

EURORDIS has over 900 member organisations in 74 countries, representing altogether more than 4000 different diseases. EURORDIS uses its pivotal position to build the capacity of patients and organisations to inform, educate, and raise awareness about rare diseases. EURORDIS believes that the community secures strength in numbers and through acting together in a coordinated way we can move forward solutions.

To achieve this goal, the key activities of EURORDIS include:

- Build a movement and network of patient organisations across Europe and internationally and support the development of alliances and federations
- Empower people living with a rare disease by encouraging them to share information, learn from each other, and join forces
- Lead on capacity building and training of patient advocates, researchers and clinicians on healthcare, research and therapeutic development
- Advocacy on rare diseases policy and legislation (EC, EP, EMA, WHO, UN and UN MSs)

b. <u>UEMS</u>

According to its articles of association, the UEMS objectives are to promote the harmonization of training standards for specialist physicians within the European Union and to promote free movement of specialist doctors within the European Union. The UEMS is independent from medical industry in order to assure unbiased position in areas of medical politics and in accreditation of CME.

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The key activities of the UEMS include:

- Political lobbying (European Commission, Parliament, Support of NMAs)
- Standard setting for specialist training and practice
- Accreditation of continuing medical education (CME) and continuing professional development (CPD)
- Control of exam procedures

The UEMS members are delegated by 41 National Medical Associations. Specialist Sections, their Divisions and Boards, and Multidisciplinary Joint Committees are UEMS bodies, created to promote and defend the interests of medical specialists in their respective fields and to improve the quality of medical specialist training and practice at the European level.

5. MUTUAL RECOGNITION

Each Party acknowledges the competences of the other, according to its articles of association.

Each Party acknowledges that the other is an essential partner in the development and improvement of the quality of medical specialist practice of diagnosis, treatment, education and aftercare of the rare and undiagnosed patients and specialists involved in their care. Parties recognize that their continued collaboration should be a crucial and integral element to the future success of both organizations and their members.

6. AREAS OF COOPERATION BETWEEN THE UEMS AND THE EURORDIS

Parties undertake to collaborate in order to achieve the objectives of mutual interest. The areas of collaboration between the UEMS and EURORDIS can include, but shall not be limited to:

- Elaboration of European, and worldwide specialist training curriculum
- Partnering in launch of European Board of Rare and Undiagnosed Diseases (EBRUD)
- Organisation of specialist European examinations available for worldwide candidates
- Organisation of visitation programs
- Development and promotion of high quality, unbiased CME/CPD
- Setting European, and worldwide standards of specialist practice

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- Explore accreditation of training programmes and other educational activities such as conferences or webinars focused on the development of expertise in rare diseases
- Provision of joint opinion and statements to the EU/worldwide institutions
- Advocacy action including provision of joint opinion and statements to the EU institutions
- Networking between specialties. Engagement with both trainee representatives, medical experts, researchers and patient organizations and promote meaningful patientprofessional-partnership.

The UEMS and EURORDIS commit to working in close cooperation and to actively exchange information that is of common interest and/or might be of significance to both organizations and their members.

Parties recognize that:

- Each Party is a key partner in areas of collaboration described in this document
- EURORDIS concentrates on organization and networks of patients, researchers and experts, to engage in scientific research, development of practice guidelines and standards
- UEMS expertise concentrates on accreditation of CME/CPD, elaboration of Training Requirements and curricula and organization of European Examinations

Parties agree to involve the other Party when elaborating major policy documents at the earliest possible stage of the process in order to receive its input.

7. EUROPEAN BOARD

The UEMS and EURORDIS acknowledge that the MJC RUD is the framework for cooperation and the forum for discussion between representatives of both Parties. EURORDIS recognizes that MJC RUD is a UEMS body and should follow the rules of the UEMS described in its Statutes and Rules of Procedures.

The Parties will closely cooperate to establish satisfactory representation of each Party in MJC RUD.

The UEMS Boards are education arms of the UEMS entries. The parties aware that the UEMS, and UEMS MJC RUD goals include establishment and launch of the EBRUD. The EURORDIS hereby join to this endeavor, according to the spirit and basic principles of the present MoU.

8. COMMUNICATION

The MJC RUD will be in charge of communication with EURORDIS in all matters regarding areas of cooperation defined in this MoU, including communications to the UEMS Executive, other UEMS bodies and to UEMS constituency. This MoU does not change the UEMS representation rules described in statutory documents or waive information and approval duties of MJC RUD.

EURORDIS will communicate with MJC RUD in all matters regarding areas of cooperation defined in this MoU.

EURORDIS and the MJC RUD will each appoint a person for all contacts with the other party. Should there be a change in each Party's contact person, the partner shall inform each other as soon as possible.

Both parties will provide a link on their website to the other's website.

a. Official announcement

An official announcement of the present agreement will be made on both Parties websites as a common statement by the UEMS and EURORDIS after signature of the agreement. The statement will be also circulated to both Parties constituency.

9. REPRESENTATION

The President of EURORDIS or an appointed representative of EURORDIS is invited to take part to the UEMS MJC RUD's executive meetings.

Likewise, the President of the UEMS Section and Secretary or another representative of the MJC RUD is invited to take part in meetings of EURORDIS conferences, workshops or agreed meetings.

10. FUNDING

This MoU does not include the exchange of funds between parties.

11. MODIFICATION

This MoU can be modified or amended only by a writing signed by both parties.

12. TERM AND TERMINATION

This MoU is concluded for an indefinite period.

13. EFFECTIVITY

This MoU is effective immediately upon signature of all parties here to.
